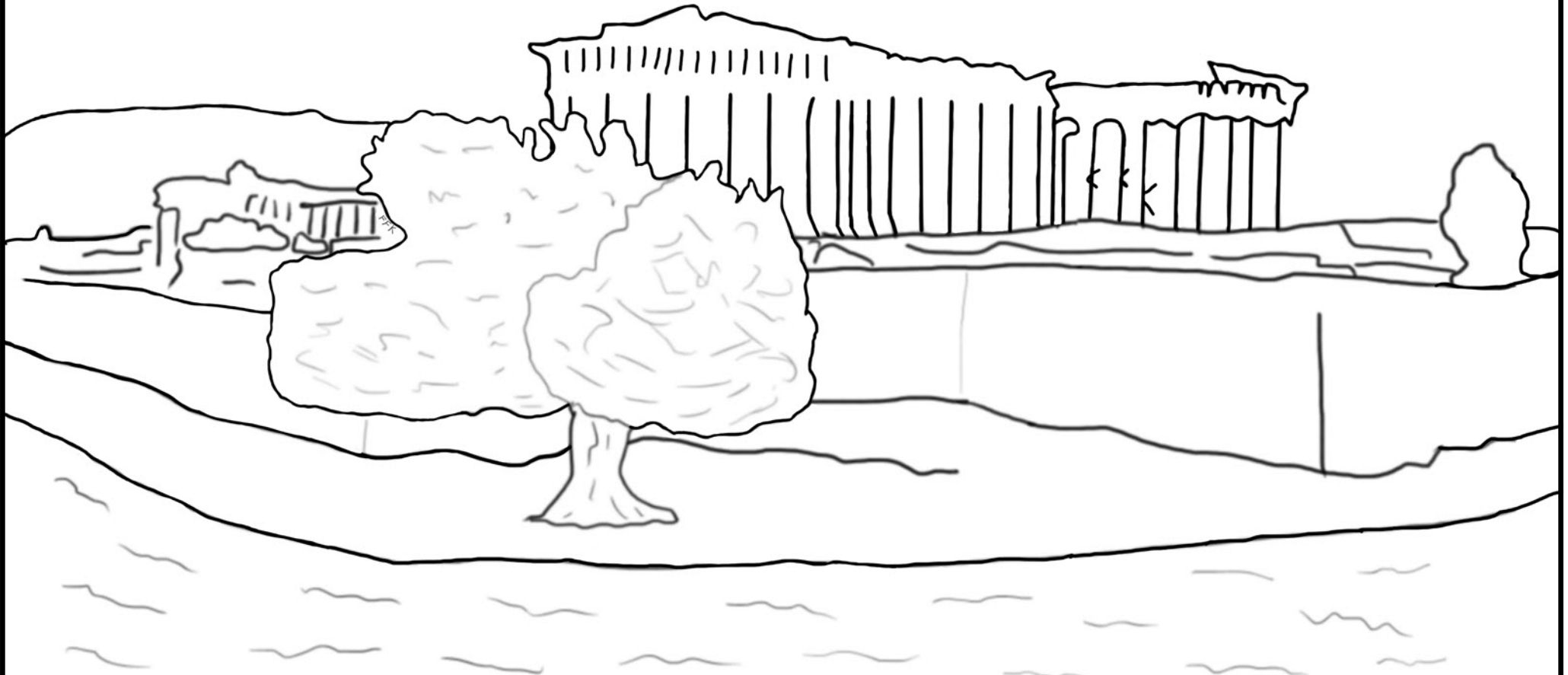


THE NAMING OF ATHENS
